

BOARD MEETING BRIEFS

August 11, 2015

The Logan County Board of Education met in regular session on August 11, 2015 at the Superintendent's Office.

1. The meeting was called to order by Kenneth Robertson with John Dawson, Phil Baker and Tim Hall present. Ralph Cropper was absent.
2. The invocation was given by Mr. Robertson.
3. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all.
4. Approved the creation of a Kindergarten teaching position at Chandlers School.
5. Approved the creation of a Kindergarten Paraeducator at Chandlers School.
6. Approved the update of two procedures.
7. Adopted the rate of \$.440 per one hundred dollars for real and personal property tax and the rate of \$.460 per one hundred dollars for motor vehicle.

Lewisburg:
