July 14, 2015

The Logan County Board of Education met in regular session on July 14, 2015, at the Superintendent's Office. The following business was conducted:

1. The meeting was called to order by Kenneth Robertson with John Dawson, Phillip Baker and Ralph Cropper present. Tim Hall was absent.
2. The invocation was given by Mr. Robertson.
3. Approved the second reading of policy updates.
4. Approved the District Assurance for 2015-2016.
5. Approved the creation of an Assistant Finance Officer for the Central Office.
6. Approved the first reading of policy updates.
7. Approved Special Called Meeting on July 23rd at 5:00.

Good News:

DISTRICT:

- Logan County Schools will have in place a 24/7 communication service that allows students, parents, and community members to anonymously report wrongdoing, bullying and negative issues that would impede the learning process. The Safe School Helpline provides reporting systems to over 6,000 schools across the U.S. to help stop trouble before it starts.

ADAIRVILLE:

- The Family Resource Youth Service Center and the Adairville School library hosted a Summer Reading Extravaganza June 8-11 for students who had completed K-5th grade. 41 students attended, and as a group they read over 236 books! Their achievements were celebrated on Thursday with a beach party that included an inflatable water slide, snow cones, and free books.

AUBURN:

- Auburn received the Middle Schools to Watch Award in Washington, D.C. on June 26. Auburn is one of three schools in KY to receive this award four times. The other two schools are Olmstead and Adairville.

CHANDLERS:

- Six teachers have chosen to take part in the Race-to-the-Top teacher initiative focusing on developing real-world connections and achieving technology integration.

LEWISBURG:

- On June 27th thirty members of the Lewisburg Jr. Beta Club attended the National Junior Beta Convention at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville. The club had previously qualified to participate at the National Convention in two categories at the State Convention in Louisville in March: Songfest and Spelling. Everyone performed their very best and proved to be the leaders that they are.
- The Family Resource Youth Service Center hosted a Summer Reading Extravaganza for students who have completed grades K-5. Forty six students participated in the week's activities including reading, math games and more. The group read over 200 books during the week.

OLMSTEAD:

- The Lady Rams Basketball Team participated in Belmont University's June summer camp. The team finished the weekend long camp with a record of 7 – 2 with 5 wins over high school JV teams from various states.
- Olmstead Jr. Beta members **Emily Oliver** and **Rachel Taylor** competed at the June Jr. Beta National Convention in Nashville. Emily entered the Acrylic Painting category and Rachel competed in the Language Arts test and placed 10th nationally.

LCHS:

- Logan County High School achieved the top 10 percent among Kentucky's public high schools/Technology Centers and Career and Technology Centers in College and Career Readiness rankings.
